Upcoming Club Shoots

Side X Side & 20 Gauge Shoot

The club will be holding its annual side x side and 20-guage shoot on **September 9**th. This event is open to all club members in good standing.

These are two separate shoots. The shooter cannot use the same shotgun for both shoots.

Any double barrel, side x side shotgun, of any gauge is eligible. Barrels and ammunition must be within our club range rules limits.

Any 20-guage shotgun (does not need to be a side x side) is eligible as long as the barrel and ammunition is within our club range rules limits.

The course of fire for both shoots is 50 clay targets from the 16-yard line.

Classes (based on shooter's total score)

A: 50-40 B: 39-34 C: 33-26

D: 25-0



Club certificates will be awarded to the top three shooters in each class for each shoot.

All Gun Shoot

The club will be holding an all gun shoot on **September 30th**. This event is open to all club members in good standing and requires the shooter to fire in all three categories: Pistol, Rifle, & Shotgun.

Pistol- 20 shots at 25-yards. Any caliber is eligible. All shots will be taken in the offhand (standing) position.

Rifle- 20 shots with any MD legal deer rifle. No shooting equipment is allowed except a scope and sling. Seven shots will be taken offhand (standing) at 100-yards, 7 shots from the kneeling position at 150-yards. And 6 shots will be taken in the prone position at 200-yards.

Shotgun- Shooters will complete one round of 16-yard trap using any trap range eligible shotgun.

Club certificates will be awarded to the top three shooters.

Refer to your club booklet for rules and details.

Tuesday Night Trap Shoot

The club hosts a trap shoot each Tuesday that is open to the public. Gates open at 4:30p and shooting continues under the lights until 8:00p

Prices per Squad: \$5 for club members. \$6 for non-members.

Check club trap range rules for barrel sizes and shot shell limitations.
