News

Legislation

Federal

- The argument phase of a very significant gun control case (New York State Rifle & Pistol Association Inc v. City of New York, New York) was heard by the U.S. Supreme Court on 12/02/2019. The case stems from the New York City ordnance mentioned at an earlier meeting. The city had a two-handgun possession permit system; one that allowed carry outside one's home and another that authorized possession only at home or at one's place of business. The 'at home' permit prohibited carry to a second home and shooting ranges outside of the city. You could carry only to seven specific shooting ranges within the city.
- The ordnance was challenged by a number of pro-gun organizations but lower courts, to include a Federal appeals court, sided with the city. When the Supreme Court decided to hear the case, New York City revised the ordnance and petitioned the Supreme Court not to hear the case as the change to the ordnance made the case moot. The Supreme Court rejected the city's plea and decided to hear the case anyway.
- A number of Democratic U.S. Senators then filed a brief with the Supreme Court arguing that the Court was 'too politically tainted' to hear the case and that if it did, the Democrats would restructure the Court in the future. This was a blatant attempt to coerce the Court to drop the case, but the Court has held firm and will hear the case.
- This is the first major gun rights case that the Court has heard in about a decade, and many believe it could result in a very significant ruling on gun rights by setting a precedent that will affect future gun rights cases.
- Based on the arguments heard on 12/2, it seems likely that the case will be dismissed, but the Court has until late June to make their decision.

Anne Arundel County Gun Violence Prevention Task Force

- Some of the recommendations of the Anne Arundel County Task Force are beginning to trick out. These include supporting Anne Arundel County Legislation that would;
 - Require reporting of lost or stolen guns within 48 hours in the County vs. the Maryland State law requirement of 72 hours
 - Require, again in Anne Arundel County, that any firearm left unattended in an area accessible to minor children be secured with a child safety lock
- The Task Force's initial findings and recommendations are to be reported out by December 15, 2019





Maryland's 2019-2020 Deer Season Update

Opening Firearms Weekend

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources announced that hunters reported **8,061** deer taken on opening day of the 2019 Maryland firearm season, 11/30. That number includes **4,248** antlered deer and **4,953** antlerless deer (**147** of the antlered deer were sika, **126** of them were antlerless sika). The opening day total represents a **29%** increase over last year's Saturday opener harvest, but the overall weekend harvest of **9,201** was down **9%** from 2018's opening weekend due to the constant rain and heavy wind across the state on Sunday.

Hunters in Region A — Allegany, Garrett, and western Washington counties — harvested **878** antlered deer. Hunters in Region B — the rest of the state — harvested **3,370** antlered and **4,953** antlerless deer.

The Junior Hunt weekend had beautiful weather, resulting in a harvest of **2,423**. The harvest was **12%** higher than the Youth Hunt weekend harvest of **2,164** last year. Juniors registered **1,471** antlered and **952** antlerless deer.

Early Season Archery & Muzzleloader Harvest

The Maryland Department of Natural Resources also announced that hunters harvested 21,073 deer during the early portion of the archery and muzzleloader seasons (September & October). Of this number, 692 were antlered sika deer and 681 were antlerless sika deer.

This number represents a 12% increase from last year's harvest of 18,839 deer for the same period. This isn't surprising, as last year's early deer season was hampered by an abundance of rain.

Hunters harvested 647 deer on Sundays that were open to archery hunting during the period, accounting for 6% of the total archery harvest.

Goose Season

Make sure you've got your stamps! Maryland's migratory Atlantic
Population (AP) Canada goose season starts
12/20 and runs thru 1/4 for the first half of the split, with the second split starting 1/14 and running thru 1/31. Bag limit is one goose per day, one half- hour before sunrise to sunset.

Duck Season

The last split of duck season starts 12/16 and runs thru 1/31. Daily bag limit is 6 ducks, no more than:

2ea of mallards (only 1 can be a hen), black ducks, canvasbacks, hooded mergansers, redheads & scaup

3 wood ducks

1 pintail, fulvous tree duck, mottled duck

5 sea ducks (no more than 4 scoters, 4 longtailed ducks or 4 eiders)

Range Rules Review

When bringing a guest to the club to shoot, please remember the following range rules;

The ranges are maintained for the use of members of the club. All members are required to show their current membership identification and Range Badge, upon request, to either the caretaker or any club member. Members in good standing are allowed to be accompanied by one (1) shooting guest. Members are fully responsible for the actions of their guest. **A guest will shoot under the direct supervision of the member.** One shooting booth shall be shared for the use of the member and guest. **Direct supervision means the member watches all of the shooting guest's actions including handling of firearms.**

Spotting must be done from behind the shooting guest.

The bold underline section means that the member will be in the booth behind his guest at all times while the member is shooting. If the member leaves the booth and his guest remains there is the chance his guest may shoot the firearm without direct supervision and result in a major rules violation.
