Legislation

From 2A Maryland: 2020 Session - Action Alert

Legislative Report #07 March 10, 2020

The following 3 bills were passed today in the House Judiciary Committee and are now in the House. Please use the contact information below to voice your opposition.

<u>HB 0035</u> Public Safety – Firearm Telematics – Study Seeks to compel a Maryland State Police study on means for installing GPS tracking devices in firearms to locate lost and/or stolen firearms. Potentially useful in tracking the whereabouts of legally owned firearms and firearm owners. OPPOSE

<u>HB 0591</u> Public Safety – Lost or Stolen Regulated Firearm – Reporting Doubling the sentences and fines for failing to report a stolen firearm. Doubling the proposed penalty for a first offence for any subsequent offense. Changing the offense from a civil offense to a criminal offense. OPPOSE

HB 1629 Office of the Attorney General - Firearm Crime – Study (cross-file SB 1047) A totally unnecessary near duplication of a bill passed during the 2019 Session. The major difference being that last year's version was amended to place the responsibility under the Governor's Office of Crime Control and Prevention rather that under the office of the Maryland Attorney General (Brian Frosh). This version again assigns the duties to the office of the Maryland Attorney, probably to make sure the results suit the liberals anti-gun paradigm. OPPOSE

This bill is still in the JUD Committee where action is expected very soon:

HB 1104 Public Safety - Regulated Firearms – Transfer (cross-file SB 1074)

Defining "transfer" as a sale, rental, furnishing, gift, loan or any other delivery with or without compensation. Excludes a temporary change is possession when the transferor has no reason to believe the transferee intends to commit a crime; AND only when in the actual presence of the transferor. Effectively repeals legislation we backed last session. OPPOSE

THE INVASIVE (BUT DELICIOUS) NORTHERN SNAKEHEAD

The Northern Snakehead (Channa argus) is a popular game fish that got its start in Maryland in such a sensational fashion that a horror movie based on it came out in 2004. In about the year 2000, a local man released two of them in a Crofton pond after buying them in NY and keeping them as pets for two years. They weren't discovered until 2002, and by then they had grown in numbers substantially. The pond was poisoned and the Snakehead exterminated, but the damage had been done; in 2004 they were found in the Potomac River and have since spread significantly and have grown in numbers massively. They have become a popular game fish as they are fun to fish for and are known to be extremely tasty. Local restaurants are beginning to serve Northern Snakehead as a menu option and many Snakehead fishing tournaments are being held in the spring and summer months. Mounting evidence is beginning to show that they are causing concerning harm in our local waterways. The DNR describes them as "a voracious predator of fishes, freshwater crustaceans, and amphibians". Though there are no laws or regulations that prohibit anyone from throwing them back once caught, it's highly recommended not to. Do our ecosystem a favor and eat the ugly things. 😊



FISHING FOR NORTHERN SNAKEHEAD

Northern Snakehead can get to roughly 3 feet long and often spawn multiple times per year, producing as many as 15,000 eggs each time. Popular destinations for Snakehead fishing include in and around Blackwater NWR and Mallows Bay and Mattawoman Creek on the Potomac River. Medium-heavy and heavy action rods are recommended. Popular lures include topwater frogs, chatterbait, spinnerbait, and utilizing live minnows seems to produce great results. A braided line with at least a 25lb test is also recommended. Snakehead can be caught year-round, though your best luck will likely be had in the warmer months.





The MD DNR reported that deer hunters harvested 79,457 deer during the combined archery, firearms, and muzzleloader seasons, from 9/6/2019 through 1/31/2020

The statewide harvest included 29,233 antlered and 46,777 antlerless white-tailed deer, plus 1,552 antlered and 1,895 antlerless sika deer. The harvest was 3% higher than the 2018-2019 total of 77,382 deer.
